The Community Cycling Center is a nonprofit organization dedicated to broadening access to bicycling and its benefits through hands-on programs, volunteer projects, and a neighborhood bike shop. They offer a range of programs in the bike shop such as Urban Cycling and Bike Maintenance classes for adults and Bike Camp for

kids. Limited scholarship and Earn-a-Bike options are available in classes and camps. Also offers free Adult Earn-a-Bike programs in partnership with many social service agencies where low income adults can earn a bike for while learning important bicycle safety skills. Bicycles used in programs are donated by the community and refurbished by Community Cycling Center mechanics. Refurbished bicycles are also sold in the bike shop.

**Fees:** Class prices vary. Scholarships available. Some programs are free for qualified applicants. See website or call for more information.

**Eligibility:** Programs have limited scholarship options available. To qualify, individuals must demonstrate they qualify as "low income" by completing an application. For Adult Earn-a-Bike programs, registration is completed through social service agents. See website or call for more information.

**Intake procedure:** Scholarship applications must be completed to be considered for class or camp scholarship. For Adult Earn-a-Bike program, talk to your social service agent to be referred. See website or call for more information.

Community Energy Project (CEP) provides free workshops on weatherization, basic lead poisoning prevention, lead-safe home project and water conservation. For income-qualified seniors and people with disabilities, they provide free weatherization and small safety repairs. Services include:

\*Weatherization workshops: basic small-scale draft-stopping measures, qualified participants receive free energy-saving materials

\*Lead Poisoning Prevention workshops: how to avoid lead poisoning when living in an older home, qualified participants receive free lead safety kit

\*Lead-Safe Home Projects: how to safely conduct lead-paint disturbing projects, qualified participants receive free lead-safe project kit
